"What the US' Mass Incarceration Regime Costs Black Women"

"On any given day, thousands of women leave homes across America and enter prison voluntarily. They furnish their own transport, often traveling for hours on public trains and buses. They clothe themselves and their children according to the correctional dress code, submitting to searches of their bodies and belongings and myriad forms of intimate regulation and humiliation. To refer to these mothers, grandmothers, partners, and co-parents of the imprisoned as "visitors" is to miss most of what is happening as they circulate in and out of prison facilities en masse."
